Whats the characteristics of a crises, what is preparedness og crises management, and some historical aspects of this.

Preparedness circle, prevention and risk reducing measures, training and awareness, how to prepare for a crisis.

Introduction of risk and voulnerability analysis, risk matrix and the municipal risk situation.

Preparedness planning, dimentioning for equipment, planning and organizing crisis management.

How to use a waterank for transporting water, mobile unit for water treatment, vacuum toilet and shower systems and mobile unit for pasteurizing black water.
